## Program 3.0 Qualified Expenditures Chart Latest Updates

An updated <u>Qualified Expenditures Chart (QEC</u>) for Program 3.0 is now available with the latest updates to assist applicants in tagging and tracking production budgets and expenditures; Program 2.0 should continue to utilize the <u>Program 2.0 QEC</u>. Applicants are strongly advised to review the <u>QEC</u> prior to project budgeting and scheduling; approved applicants should also review latest updates as changes and additional notes in the following expenditures have been made:

- Covid-19 Health and Safety Expenses
- Box Rentals
- Fringes
- Below the Line Per Diem
- Shipping and Postage
- DGA Pension

The latest changes have been highlighted in pink in the<u>QEC</u>. Additionally, a new page has been created on the California Film Commission <u>website</u> to include an alphabetized version of the QEC; please update your bookmarks accordingly.
